


Involving UCAR Members and Affiliates in your GLOBE Program



UCAR Members

Being a Member of UCAR means being a part of a community that helps shape the future direction of the atmospheric and related sciences both nationally and internationally. Virtually all of the major research universities of North America are members of UCAR; there are 70 of these currently, all of them with Ph.D.-granting programs in the atmospheric or related sciences. Additionally, 18 undergraduate and masters' degree granting institutions have official ties through UCAR's Academic Affiliates Program. Both the members and the affiliates appoint representatives to UCAR, who serve as important links between the research and teaching communities and UCAR and its programs. In addition, Members and Affiliates serve on governance and advisory committees that help shape the course of UCAR and its services to the universities.

Beyond these formal mechanisms, UCAR serves the community as a networking resource, as an education resource and as a focal point for planning. Through its advocacy activities, UCAR alerts members to legislative and budget issues that may affect them, educates members of Congress on scientific problems and their societal impacts, and, at times, lobbies on behalf of broad community interests.

The UCAR International Affiliates Program was established to facilitate increased international scientific cooperation, collegiality and collaboration through a more formal affiliation between UCAR and its Member universities and institutions outside of North America with research or operational programs in the atmospheric and related sciences.

The mission of the International Affiliates Program is to foster the development of collaborative research and education programs among UCAR members, NCAR and other UCAR programs, and international academic, research, and operational institutions through 1) collaborative research efforts; 2) exchange of students and visitors; 3) exchange of data and community models; 4) newsletters, websites, email exchange; 5) special meetings with emphasis on opportunities for collaboration; and 6) exchange of teaching and other educational materials.

Two UCAR Affiliate-GLOBE relationships currently have begun:

Dong-Kyou Lee, UCAR affiliate representative and associate professor in the School of Earth and Environmental Sciences at Seoul National University, expressed great enthusiasm for the GLOBE program and the interaction with students and teachers it would afford. Subsequently, he has volunteered to serve as a co-coordinator for GLOBE in South Korea. He has already brought together Korean GLOBE teachers to plan for a workshop in 2008 and has given GLOBE presentations at several professional society meetings.

Dr. Ahmed Adedoyin Balogun, UCAR affiliate representative and professor in the School of Earth and Mineral Science at the Federal University of Technology in Akure, Nigeria, noted that his department is “enthusiastic and willing to engage in a long-term relationship with the GLOBE projects.”
