



- Cluster of about : 1190
- Stretching 823 Km north to south
- Land area : 300 sq km
- 26 Geographical Atolls
- Total population estimate: 360,000.
- Islands vary from 0.5 to 2km2
- Only 33 islands exceed 1 km2
- Inhabited islands:199
- 80% of islands are below 1m
- From MSL
- Main industries tourism,
- fisheries

- Joined in 2003 (105th country)
- Implementation of the GLOBE Program in 2007
- II member schools
- Kick started 2015
- 22 trained GLOBE teachers
