- Plans and Ideas for Next Year:
- 1. Work with BSS to restart GLOBE Data Collection at School (Oct 2022 Jan 2023).
- 2. Working with an operational GLOBE School to adopt at least one Primary School into the GP by Sep 2023.
- 3. GPTT would collaborate with the Arima Public Library to organize a Community WED Display and Demonstration (Oct 2022 June 2023).
- 4. Encouraging at least one other secondary school to participate in Growing Beyond the Earth Project and three (3) schools to restart the Globe Programme (Oct 2022 Sep 2023).
- 5. Meeting with US Embassy to get its active support in promoting the GP in T&T (Oct 2022 Sep 2023).
- 6. Establishing contact with the Tobago House of Assembly (THA) to resuscitate the GP in Tobago Schools (Oct 2022 Sep 2023).
- 7. Interacting with MoE to remind it of its responsibility with respect to the MOU signed in 1996 (Oct 2022 Sep 2023).
- 8. Working with PTAs to provide Automatic Weather Stations for schools to compliment Manual Measurements where GP was at one time functional (Oct Sep 2023).
- 9. GPTT would organize a GLOBE Outreach Programme targeting Primary Schools (Oct 2022– Sep 2023).
- 10. GLOBE and Science Popularization Outreach at a Mall (Oct 2022 Sep 2023).
- 11. Encourage schools to access the GLOBE Online E training as a prerequisite to face-to-face training by GPTT.
