# #Lime

### small-leaved lime *Tilia cordata* L.

#### **Characteristics**

Mostly found as a tree up to 30 m high.

- Leaves are deciduous, cordate (heart-like), finely serrate margins, 3-9 cm long and wide, dark green and glabrous above (reddish-brown hairs in veinaxils beneath).
- Flowers are green-yellowish and form clusters of five to eleven with a leafy yellow-green subtending bract (leaf-like formation connected to stalk).
- Fruit is a nut, aprox. 0,5 cm large, reddish-brown, smooth (no ribs or slightly ribbed) connected to a wing for better dispersal.
- Bark is brown-greenish when young, but in older individuals becomes dark brown with longitudinal ridges.



#### **Distribution**

Central. Western and eastern Europe, all the way to Russia, except Mediterranean and northern Scandinavia.



#### Don't mistake with

Small-leaved lime can be **mistaken** for broad-leaved lime, *Tilia platyphyllos* Scop. which has larger leaves (more than 8 cm) with white hairs in vein-axils beneath. Broad-leaved lime has strongly 5-ribbed fruit (nut).
