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

So how do I start?

I will invite each of you into our UT ArcGIS Online account. You will receive an email invitation to access your account. Then go to www.storymaps.arcgis.com, and sign in. You will see your user dashboard with a gallery of your own Storymaps (once you create them). Click on the green button in the upper right to Create a New Story.

This is what my Storymaps gallery looks like.


