Joins the river Drava in Saint Marija




Four different locations:










Measurments: pH and temperature since 2015



Plants around Plitvica

Salix fragilis (vrba)

- common names crack willow
- Broken twigs and branches can take
- root readily, enabling the species to colonise new areas



Silver birch (breza)

- The silver birch is a hardy tree, a pioneer species
- It is planted decoratively in parks and gardens
- owes its common name to the white peeling bark on the trunk.



European oak (hrast)

- its important to insects and other wildlife
- Slavonian oak is a regional symbol of Slavonia and a national symbol of Croatia





European ash Fraxinus excelsior (jasen)

 European ash contains many substances known for their medical benefits.

 The resilience and rapid growth made it an important resource for smallholders and farmers.





American pokeweed (kermes)

 All parts of the plant are toxic and pose risks to human and mammalian health





Kurika **Euonymus europaeus**

- It is a popular ornamental plant in gardens and parks
- Parts of the plant have been used medicinally.
- The fruit is poisonous, containing the alkaloids





Lijeska *Corylus avellana*

The leaves provide food for many animals
